

Ann Parillo is a retired NYS registered pharmacist and besides having owned and operated her own pharmacy in Kansas has held positions with Sterling-Winthrop Drug Company (as a manufacturing and production pharmacist); NYS Medicaid Investigator in Surveillance and Utilization (Medicaid fraud); Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (Instructor and lecturer in Professional Practice, Sterile Products and Therapeutics) and with the NYS Board of Pharmacy (Supervisor of Pharmacy Practice and Registration). She also was the Chair of the Schenectady Cable Commission until recently. She currently holds positions on the NYS Board of Physical Therapy as a public member, The ElectriCity Arts and Entertainment District Board as Board Secretary and is on the Advisory Board of the Irish American Heritage Museum and the Albany College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences Alumni Organization. She has performed with various theater groups and hosted the "Single's Talk" TV show for approximately 6 years prior to hosting Schenectady Today-In & Around the Capital Region.

*Schenectady Today -- In and Around the Capital Region* is broadcast on Public Access Channel 16, Open Stage Media at Proctors, in Schenectady (NY) and on Time Warner Channel 18 in Bethlehem, Rensselaer, Troy, Clifton Park, Albany and outlying areas. Ann Parillo's first show aired on September 16, 1998. The show is now in its 14th year.

**Show Content:** The show usually has six segments with a variety of guests interviewed each week. Regular monthly guests include Representatives from the Animal Protective Foundation and other animal groups; Faculty from the Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, Union College, Sch'dy County Community College discussing various health and community issues and representatives from City, County and State agencies. In addition, other guests include actors and directors from the Schenectady Civic Players, Schenectady Light Opera, Albany Civic Players, Classic Theater Guild, Proctors and other area theatrical groups; Tax Specialists from the Internal Revenue Service (during tax season); Representatives from Schenectady County Library and the Schenectady Museum and Representatives from area nonprofit organizations also appear. The show features a different non-profit of the month each month.
